Through this collaboration, both parties aim to integrate academic research with industry practice, strengthening long-term cooperation in teaching, research, and talent development. By combining scholarly expertise with practical insights, the partnership seeks

to lay a solid foundation for the next generation of professional leaders.

Integrating Academic Excellence with Industry Expertise

National Taipei University brings to the partnership its strong academic foundation, extensive experience in talent cultivation, and expertise in public policy. Deloitte Taiwan contributes its robust industry advisory capabilities and deep experience in professional consulting and talent development. By integrating academic and practical resources, the two institutions aspire to create impactful and sustainable outcomes.

President Lin Dao-Tong noted that the University has long been committed to advancing academic research and interdisciplinary education. In recent years, it has focused on cross-disciplinary integration, AI empowerment, diversified innovation, and dual transformation. Both the College of Business and the International College of Sustainability Innovations have systematically cultivated talent in AI, sustainability, and finance. This approach bridges academic theory and industry needs, fostering interdisciplinary integration and practical thinking. Internationalization remains a key strategic priority, and future collaboration with Deloitte Taiwan will further enhance students' practical competitiveness and global outlook through seminars, academic exchanges, and innovative business competitions.
